

The Live Project is an creative competition where participants will compete for work placements and the chance to win the prestigious "International Assembly Champions of 2024!" awards. Participants will work independently or in pairs on a creative brief, each guided by an experienced professional mentor for support, advice, and creative direction. This year's brief is set by The Brand Identity and will be unveiled at the start of the project. Upon arrival, participants will be introduced to their mentors, who will structure the daily schedule, organise meetings, critiques, and presentations.

After two days of intensive work, two participants from each group will be selected for a work placement with their mentor. Out of these finalists, one participant will be chosen to present their project to a panel of esteemed judges and compete for the "International Assembly Champions of 2024!"

The final projects from each group will be reviewed and judged by industry leaders, including The Brand Identity, Jack Renwick (President of D&AD), and Jonathan Gilbride (Brewdog). More information on the next page.

- Business cards or a piece of paper you can write your details on (not a requirement but if you meet someone you want to collaborate with or you have been chatting to someone involved in the festival it could be handy to give them your details to keep in touch.)



Advice

Arrive with a clear mind.

Don't try to presume the kind of task you will be set or the kind of outcome you will create, it's better to start fresh.

Think big.

With just a two-day brief, no one expects a fully polished or functional design by the end-so feel free to think big and push boundaries. Use this as an opportunity to explore bold, unconventional ideas without restraint.

Talk to people.

Remember, you're surrounded by talented designers, so don't isolate yourself. Share your ideas openly, speak up, ask for feedback, and invite different perspectives. Collaborate and brainstorm together to enrich your work. Seek out opinions, ask for advice, and be open to working in groups or pairing up. Great design often comes from a blend of voices and ideas, so make the most of the creative minds around you.

Go against the grain.

Don't feel pressured to follow the crowdmost people are in the same position and may be just as unfamiliar with this live brief as you are. Instead, explore different approaches: if others are working solo, see if anyone's interested in teaming up for a group project. If everyone is glued to their laptops, try something hands-on, like physical prototyping. Remember, there's no single "right" way to tackle this; experiment and discover what works for you!

Step out of your comfort zone. If you came to the project with a friend or someone you know it's easy to just stick with them, but have a go at meeting some new faces, you might get some valuable insights and different ways of working.

Leave your space.

It's easy to stay glued to your laptop for the full two days, but taking breaks and changing your environment can help ideas flow more freely. Step outside for a walk, even if it's just to grab lunch, or try sketching or jotting down notes on paper for a fresh perspective. Explore different spaces and connect with other participants—you never know where inspiration might strike.

Ask your mentors.

The mentors are there to help you, not scare you. If you have any issues or just want some advice or to talk things through, just ask. They are there because they have valuable experience in their fields so get as much knowledge from them as you can.

Finally....

Just enjoy yourself.

Make the most of your day in any way that you can. You do you!
